Studying at the FHNW School of Applied Psychology

The FHNW School of Applied Psychology has been one of the leading competence centers for work, organisational and business psychology in German-speaking countries for more than 15 years. Roughly 900 students study at our bachelors' and master's programmes where they learn about basic and advanced psychology subjects. They can major in work, organisational and personnel psychology or in business psychology.

Language Requirements

The degree programmes are mainly taught in German and we recommend a B2 level (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) command of German. For the courses taught in English at least a B2 level in English is required.

Student Activities and Support

There are several student organisations such as the StudentCouncil and the Erasmus Student Network (ESN) FHNW. These organisations run on a voluntary basis and organise activities, trips and social events for (exchange) students throughout their stay. Moreover, we organise *Welcome Days* and will provide a local *buddy* for exchange students.

Living in Switzerland

Olten has the unique privilege of being within 30 minutes of major cities such as Bern, Zurich, Lucerne, and Basel. In Switzerland there are four official languages: German, French, Italian and Romansch. The official language in Olten is German.

Cost of Living

A major part of the living costs consists of the accommodation with about 400 to 800 CHF per month. In total, exchange students should expect monthly expenses of approx. 1'500 CHF.

Visa
